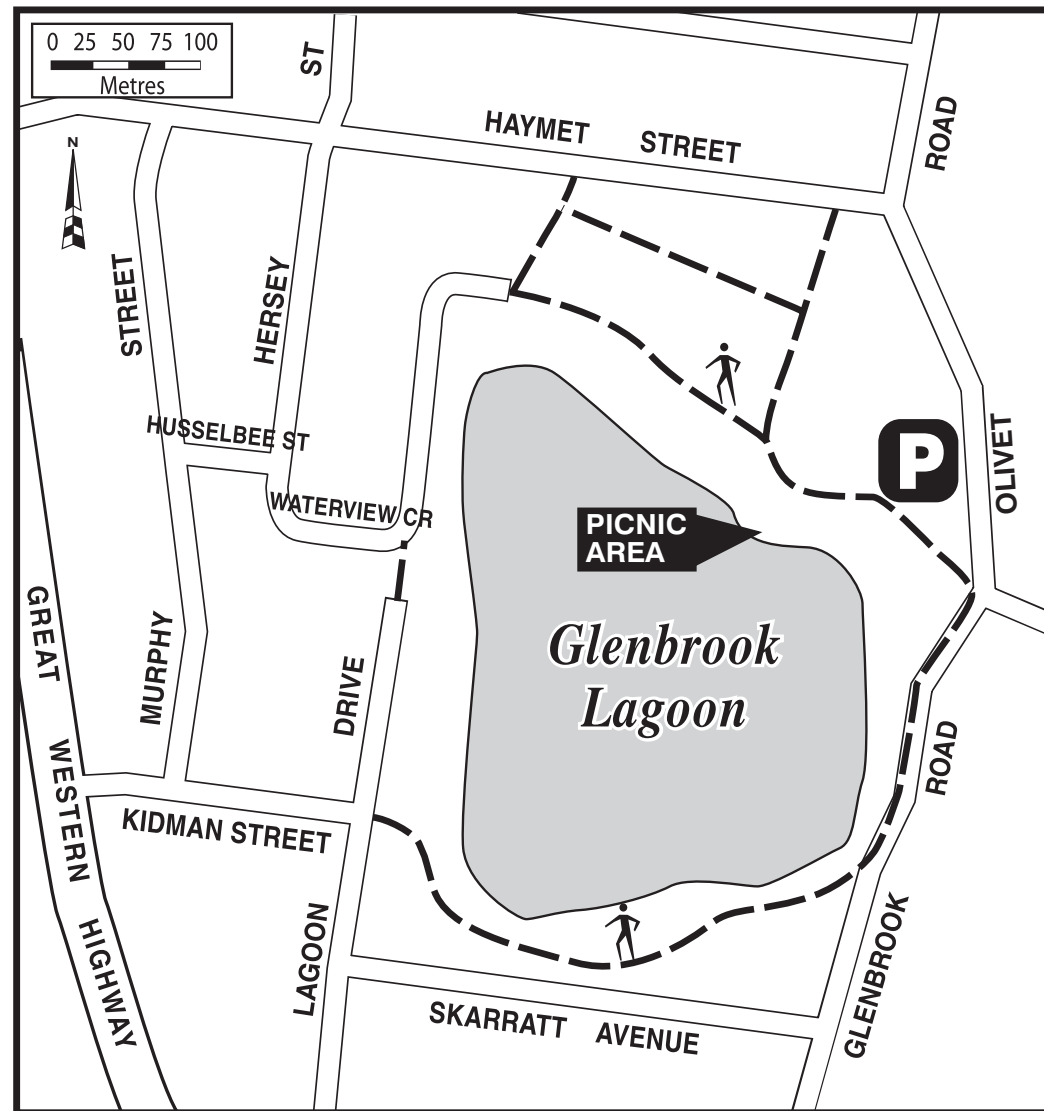


Can you hear the wind whispering through the trees?

Grade: Easy 1.0km



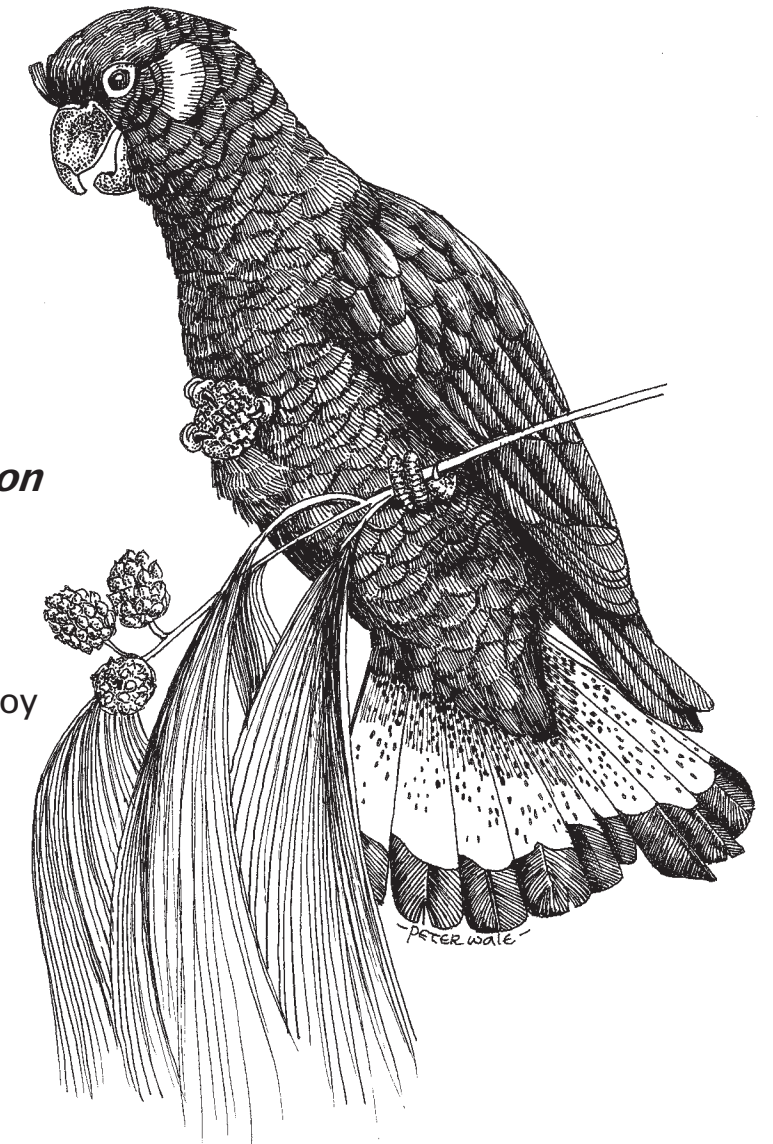
Glenbrook Lagoon is not suitable for swimming or fishing

The Black She-Oak Trees (Casurinas) create a bed of fallen needles that prevent other plant species from growing here. As a result this She-Oak forest forms and provides habitat for the Yellow-tailed Black Cockatoo and possibly the endangered Glossy Black Cockatoo (*Calyptorhynchus lathamii*).

What you can do to help protect Glenbrook Lagoon

- Keep to designated paths
- Do not dump garden refuse
- Keep dogs on leashes and pick up after your dog
- Leave native vegetation & flowers for others to enjoy
- Fires are prohibited
- Take your rubbish with you
- Leave wood and bush rock in the park for habitat for many animals
- Join a community or Bushcare group
